
Saturday, July 13th, proved to be another scorcher. We started early, 8:15 am, to accomplish as much as possible before the brutal heat arrived. Seven participants entered the arena, ready to showcase their THT skills. Temperatures dropped significantly on Sunday with ample clouds and even an afternoon thunder shower. We followed the same format as Saturday, starting with a clinic. We then began the actual test with ground work, trailer loading, grooming/ tacking, exercises under saddle, performance on the trail, and concluded with maneuvering through trail obstacles. The horse's overall attitude and temperament were judged throughout the course of the test for both groups and given the highest priority of all sections.
